VALUE of the Month: Togetherness

Content will include

- Name, age and gender
- Naming the place/locality
- Uses and functions of all the body parts
- Roles and responsibilities of family members
- Understanding other's feelings
- Uses of his/her things
- Preparing I like... book
- Uses of different rooms in a house
- How do friends help us
- How do school and facilitator help us and how can I keep my classroom clean
- Way to worship God

The activities planned in this month will help to develop the following skills:

I Listen I Know I Speak

This area includes building skills in communication through speaking, using body language and gestures and understanding what others say.

Listening

Story sessions will include the following story

1. I Love My Family

Speaking

- 1. Children will be exposed to sounds in the environment and the rhymes such as:
 - i. Special 'Me'
 - ii. Little Me
 - iii. My Body Parts
 - iv. Ten Little Fingers
- 2. Opportunities for free conversation related to the theme 'Myself'.

Listening

- Story sessions will include the following stories:

- Children will be reinforced to the alphabet song in the phonic manner.

Speaking

- Encouragement to recite the sounds of the phonetic alphabet
- Promotion of the terms 'circular', 'strokes', 'semicircular' etc.
- Blending of the phonic sounds of the letters H, L, T and F with each other to create new sounds.

Listening

- Story sessions will include the following stories:
 - 1. New Friends
 - 2. The Shepherd and the Tiger

Speaking

- Children will be exposed to sounds in the environment and the rhymes such as:
 - 1. Rhyme Time
 - 2. My Shape
- Encouragement to frame simple sentences using the letters/words learnt in their phonic class using the words such as lion, hen, fish etc.

Reading

- · Picture to letter association
- · Letter to letter association
- Recognition of the letters V, K and Y
- Reading 'My Phonic Book'

Writing

- Tracing and writing of the capital letters V, K and Y
- Creating their own phonic book of letters T, F, V, K and Y

Listening

- Story sessions will include the following story:
 - 1. The Lazy Horse

Speaking

- Children will be exposed to sounds in the environment and rhymes such as:
 - 1. Traffic Light
 - 2. Rocket Ride
 - 3. All the Way
- Encouragement to frame simple sentences using the words learnt in the phonicinstruction, such as watch, zebra, queen, cow, gate and sun.
- Blending of phonic sounds of the letters N, W, Z, C, G, S and B with each other to create new sounds.

Reading

- Picture to letter association
- Letter to letter association





Reading 'My phonic book'

- Tracing and writing the capital letters Q, C, G, S and B
- Creating their own phonic book of letters W, Z, Q, C, G and S

I Am Ready

This area focuses on building thinking skills including learning, understanding, problem-solving, reasoning, and remembering through positive learning experiences

Oral

- Concept and recognition of '6', '7', '8', and '9'
- Concept of Slow-Fast and Left-Right
- Concept of Up and Down in Water

Written

- Tracing and writing of the numbers '6', '7', '8', and '9'
- Joining the dots to form a picture playing a number game through the activity 'Fun with Numbers'
- Solving application-based worksheets on the concepts mentioned above

This area will enable the child to use his/her hands not able to eat and dress, but to draw, play, write, be creative and inventive and in the process develop aesthetic skills.

- Children will recreate the world of transportation by manipulating different materials and creating vehicles through different skills such as:
 - 1. Printing

 - 4. Sprinkling
- Children will also learn to use waste material (ice-cream sticks) through these activities.

- Children will face numerous simulated situations involving eating and cooking food that will instill in them the following life skills:
 - 1. Habits of cleanliness
 - 2. Table manners
 - 3. Independence
- Children will relate the value of healthy food with junk food through a story.

I Me Myself & My Friends

- Children will learn to exhibit pro social behaviour while playing together in *Role plays* and *Pretend plays*, build upon the theme of Food.
- These activities will also promote their imagination skills.
- · Children will learn the importance of drinking milk through rhyme.







THEME of the Month: PEOPLE WHO HELP US

VALUE of the Month: Dignity of Labour

Content will include

- Reinforcement of naming and identifying professions of: Maid, Sweeper, Washer man, Carpenter,
 Driver, Watchman, Milkman, Barber, Cobbler, Gardener and Baker
- Naming and identifying professions of : Electrician, Mechanics, Plumber, Postman, Teacher, Florist, Tailor, Potter, Waiter, Fireman and Postman
- Type of work each one does
- Skill required doing the job
- Appreciation of each one's work

The activities planned in this month will help to develop the following skills:

I Listen I Know I Speak

This area includes building language skills that entails listening, speaking, reading and writing.

Listening

- Story sessions will include the following stories:
 - 1. The Journey of a Letter
 - 2. Little Riya

Speaking

- Children will be exposed to sounds in the environment and rhymes such as:
 - 1. Five Helpers
 - 2. What do you do?
- Speaking the alphabet in a sequential and rhyming manner.
- Story telling using the phonic words that have been taught.
- Blending of phonic sounds of the letters A, E, I, O, U with each other to create new sounds.

- Writing the letters of the alphabet from A to Z in the upper case.

Oral

- Reverse counting from 10 to 1 through 'Ten Little Maids'
- · Concept of 'Less' and 'More'
- Rote counting from 1 to 40
- · Memory game based on helpers

Written

- Link numeral to concept (1 to 5) with the help of objects
- Matching numbers from 1 to 10 through the activity 'Mailbox Match'
- Writing the reverse counting from 10 to 1

I Can Do Wonders

This area will enable the child to use his/her hands not only to eat and dress, but to draw, play, write, be creative and inventive and in the process develop aesthetic skills.

- Children will learn to create uniforms worn by 'people who help us' and will thus aesthetically appreciate the importance of each. While doing so, they'll practice:
 - 1. Cutting
 - 2. Sticking
 - 3. Paper folding
 - 4. Colouring
 - 5. Decorating
 - 6. Clay modelling
 - 7. Sprinkling
 - 8. Painting with straw



I Can & I Do

This area focuses on large muscle development and coordination based on the developmental needs of the child.

- Children will participate in games that will reinforce the various jobs done by the helpers while practising:
 - 1. Running on patterns
 - 2. Hopping
 - 3. Performing simple exercises
 - 4. Jumping

This area focuses on development of personal awareness which entails building independence, self-help skills, hygiene and safety.

 - 1. Self-help skills
 - 2. Awareness on personal safety
 - 3. Independence
- Value of 'Dignity of Labour' will be highlighted through a story.

I Me Myself & My Friends

- Children will demonstrate a relatively keen understanding of feelings of self and others, and will learn to appreciate the community workers through:
 - 1. Group games
 - 2. Role play

VALUE of the Month: Respectfulness

The activities planned in this month will help to develop the following skills:

This area includes building language skills that entail listening, speaking, reading and writing.

 - Encouragement to frame simple sentences using the words learnt in the past few months.

 - 2. Free hand drawing using squeezy bottle
 - 3. Collage work

- Reinforcement of all the themes covered so far will give children yet another opportunity to test their gross motor ability through games involving:
 - 1. Running
 - 2. Hopping
 - 3. Throwing
 - 4. Jumping
 - 5. Standing on toes
- Combined with these activities, children will learn to create their own games, and will learn to manoeuvre the playground equipment safely.
